

PHIA Essentials for Custodians Training Outline

The Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner has developed an interactive workshop focused on learning the basics of access to information and privacy rules under Nova Scotia's *Personal Health Information Act (PHIA)*.

This 3 hour workshop is free of charge, includes an extensive toolkit, and is intended for regulated health professionals and/or their delegates who have responsibilities related to access and privacy in handling of personal health information.

- a. Individual right of access
- b. Fees
- c. Record of user activity
