
Improving Access to Information for Nova Scotians:


Arilea Sill

Arilea has over 20 years' experience in records, information access and privacy services.



Tricia Ralph

Tricia Ralph was appointed the Information and Privacy Commissioner for Nova Scotia in March 2020. As Commissioner, she works with a team of access and privacy experts. Together, they are responsible for resolving freedom of information and privacy complaints brought forward by individual members of the public, either by informal resolution or by a formal review process. The Commissioner also provides advice and comments on access and privacy matters that affect Nova Scotians. Tricia holds a Bachelor of Laws and a Masters of Health Administration from Dalhousie University.



Raphael Vagliano

Raphael Vagliano is a legal officer at the Centre for Law and Democracy, where he focuses on advocacy for freedom of expression and the right to information. He holds dual degrees in common and civil law from McGill University and a bachelor's degree in political science from Columbia University. After completing his law studies, he worked for a year as a Law Foundation of Ontario Public Interest Articling Fellow at Amnesty International Canada before practicing as a refugee lawyer in Toronto for four and a half years.
